## An ACT about binding to the peace.

DE it enacted, &c. That whofoever shall threaten the One justice may perfon of another, to wound, kill or deftroy him, or do him any harm in perfon or eftate, and the perfon fo threatened shall appear before a justice of the peace, and atteft, that he believes that by fuch threatning he is in danger to be hurt in body or effate; fuch perfon fo threatening as aforefaid, shall be bound over, with one sufficient furety, to appear at the next feffions or county court, to be holden for the county where fuch offence was committed, to be proceeded against according to law; and, in the mean time, to be of his good behaviour, and keep peace towards all the king's subjects.

An ACT for naturalization.

Preamble

**NORASMUCH** as the just encouragement of the inhabitants of this province and territories, is likely to be an effectual way for the improvement thereof; and fince fome of the people that live thercin, and are likely to come thereinto, are foreigners, and not freemen, according to the acceptation of the laws of Eng land, the confequences of which may prove very detrimental to them in their effates and traffic, and injurious to the prosperity of this province and territories :
