It is therefore for the Honour of God and the propagation of Reli- The character of gion, and the continued welfare of this Colony Ordered by this Court and the Authority thereof, That the faid Churches already gathered, or that thall hereafter be orderly gathered, may and shall from time to time by this Government be protected and encouraged, in their peaceable and orderly walking, and the Faithful, Able, Orthodox, Teaching Ministry thereof. derly walking, and the Faithful, Able, Orthodox, Teaching Ministry thereof, and for. duely encouraged and provided for; together with fuch other Orthodox able Difpenfers of the Gofpel, which shall or may be placed in any Townflip in this Government, where there is or may be defect of Church Order.

And Finally, it is Ordered and Declared by this Court and the Authority thereof, That all these foregoing Orders and Constitutions, are fo Fundamentally effectial to the just Rights, Liberties, Common good and talk inviolatily special end of this Colony, as that they shall special end of this Colony, as that they shall and ought to be inviolably preferved.

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CAPITAL LAWS

CHAP. II.

T is Enacted by this Court and the Authority thereof, That if Melatry, any person having had the knowledge of the true God, openly and manifelly, Have or Worship any other God but the Lead God, he shall be put to Death, I red. 22.20. Deat. 13. 6, 12.

2. If any Person within this Jurisdiction, professing the true God, shall Blassherry wittingly and willingly prefume to Blairhame the Holy Name of God, Father, Son or Holy Ghoft, with direct, express, presumptions or highhanded Blasphemy, either by wilful or oblimate denying of the true God, or His Creation or Government of the World; or shall Curse God, Father, Sen or Holy Ghoft, such Person shall be put to Death, Levit. 24.15, 6.

Treason.

- 3. Treason against the Person of our Soveraign Lord the King, the State and Common wealth of England, shall be puunished by Death.
- Conspiring 2guick this Jurildiction.
- 4. That whosoever shall Conspire and Attempt any Invasion, Insurrection, or Publick Rebellion against this Jurisdiction, or the Surprizal of any Town, Plantation, Fortification or Amunition, therein provided for the safety thereof, or shall Treacherously and Persidiously Attempt and Endeavour the Alteration and Subversion of the Fundamental Frame and Constitutions of this Government; every such Person shall be put to weath.

- 5. If any Person stall Commit wilfull Murther by killing any Man, Woman or Childe, upon premeditated Malice, Hatred or Cruelty, not in a way of necessary and just Desence, nor by casualty against his Will; he shall be put to Death.

- 6. If any Person slayeth another' suddenly in Anger and Cruelty of Passion; he shall be put to Death.

- 7. If any Person shall slay another through Guile, either by Poysora ing or other such Develish practises; he shall be put to Death.
- Witcheraft.
- 8. If any Christian (so called) be a Witch, that is, hath, or constulteth with a Familiar Spirit; he or they shall be put to Death.
- Bestiality'.
- 9. If any Person lyeth with a Beast or Bruit Creature, by Carnal Copulation, they shall surely be put to Death, and the Beast shall be slain and buried and not eaten.
- Soddomy.
- both of them have committed Abomination; they both shall surely be put to Death, unless the one party were forced, or be under fourtem years of Age: And all other Sodomitical filthiness, shall be surely punished according to the nature of it.

- pose to take away any Mens life; he shall be put to Death.

- 12. If any Man Stealeth Man-kinde, he shall be put to Death or otherwise grievously punished:
- Curfing or Imite ing Phiker of Mittler.
- 13. If any Childe or Children above fixteen years old, and of competent Understanding, shall Curse or Smite their Natural Father or Mother, he or they shall be put to Death, unless it can be sufficiently testified that the Parents have been very Unchristianly negligent in the Education of such Children, or so provoked them by extream and cruel Correction, that they have been forced thereunto, to preserve themselves from Death or Mainning.

- 14. If a Man have a Stubborn or Rebellious Son, of sufficient years and understanding (riz.) fixteen years of Age, which shall not obey the voice of his Father, or the voice of his Mother, and that when they have chastened him, will not hearken unto them; then shall his Father and Mother, being his natural parents, lay hold on him, and bring him before

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cient years t obey the they have Father and him before the Magistrates assembled in Court, and testifie unto them, that their Son is Stubborn and Rebellious, and will not obey their voice and chaftifement, but lives in fundry notorious crimes; fuch a Son shall be put to Death, or otherwise severely punished.

15. If a Man shall Ravish a Maid or Woman, committing Carnal Copulation with her by force; that is above the age of ten years, or if Rape. shee were under ten years of age, though her will was gained by him, he shall be punished with Death or some other grievous punishment, according as the Fact may be circumstanced.

16. Whofoever shall wilfully or on purpose, Burn any House, Ship, with hurning Barque or other Veffel of confiderable value; fuch perfor final be put of Housen, Ships to Death, or otherwife grievously punished, as the case and circumstances of it may require.

CHAP. III.

CRIMINALS:

It is Ordered by this Court and the Authority thereof; That what perfon foever is to Answer any Crimmal Ossence, whether they be in prifon or under Bayle, his Case shall be heard and determined at the next Court that hath proper cognizance thereof, and may be done without prejudice of Justice.

2. It is Enacted by this Court, &c. That who oever shall Commit Adultery how Adultery with a Married Woman, or one Betrothed to another Man, both of them shall be severely punished, by whipping two several times, viz. once when the Court is in being, at which they were Convict of Fact, and the fecond time as the Court shall Order; and likewise to wear two Capital Letters, A. D. cut out in Cloth and sewed on their uppermost Garments, on their Arm or Back; and if at any time they shall be found without the faid Letters fo worne, whileft in this Government, to be forthwith taken and publickly whipt, and fo from time to time as often as they are found not to wear them.

3. Be it also Enacted, That who oever Committeth Fornication, lie- Fornication fore, or without lawful Contract, shall be punished by whipping, or else withoutcontract pay ten founds fine each of them, and be imprisoned during the pleasure of the Court, not exceeding three dayes; but if they be or will be Mar- 16 they be or will ried to each other, then but ten pounds both, and imprisoned as aforesaid, be Matried by lawful Contract, the Court understanding the mutual concent of Parents, Guardians or Overseers, and a soleinn promise of Marriage made to each other by the parties, before competent Witnesses.

And if any Commit Carnal Copulation after Contract, before Mar- Aler Contract riage, they shall be Amerced each of them fifty smillings, and be imprisoned if the Court ice Reason; And if any cannot or imprisoned if the Court ice Reason;
